### 1 Welcome and Opening

#### 1.1 Acknowledgement of Country

At the opening of the Board Meeting, the Presiding Member, the Lord Mayor stated:

'Kadaltilla / Adelaide Park Lands Authority acknowledges that we are meeting on traditional Country of the Kurna people of the Adelaide Plains and pays respect to Elders past and present. We recognise and respect their cultural heritage, beliefs and relationship with the land. We acknowledge that they are of continuing importance to the Kurna people living today. And we also extend that respect to other Aboriginal Language Groups and other First Nations who are present today.'

### 3 Presiding Member Report (verbal)

The Presiding Member provided a verbal report on various matters:

- Welcome two new members of the Board, Sally Underdown and Daniel Bennett, along with returning member Tim Agius, and his deputy member Allan Sumner.
  - Daniel is the founding Director of Sleepshill Design Office and a registered landscape architect and urban designer with over 25 years of experience in strategic and design projects.
  - Sally has a diverse career in public service and the not-for-profit sector, and she is currently the Alcohol and Drug Foundation SA & NT State Manager.
  - Tim is the KYAC Chair and was nominated by the KYAC Board on 30 January 2026 for appointment to the Kadaltilla Board.
- The Council representatives to the Board were endorsed by Council and Minister Nick Champion MP, with their appointments gazetted in February 2026.
- The Board acknowledged outgoing members Justyna Jochym on 30 October 2025 and Allison Bretones on 27 November 2025, and we should also thank Mitzi Nam and proxy Dennis Rigney for their contributions who have concluded their term as the KYAC nominated representatives. Their commitment, advocacy, and guidance, especially in finalising the Adelaide Park Lands Management Strategy – Towards 2036, have been highly valued.
- The Premier announced on 19 February 2026 that the Australian Motorcycle Grand Prix would move to South Australia from November 2027, and that the event would run as a street circuit, along Adelaide's former Grand Prix racetrack.
- The South Australian Motorsport Board have advised that The MotoGP circuit has been designed to meet the rigorous and stringent safety requirements of the world governing body for motorcycle racing, FIM
- The announcement was made while the Lord Mayor was on leave, and in her absence, the

Deputy Lord Mayor, Councillor Carmel Noon, requested a meeting with the South Australian Motor Sport Board to better understand what is planned and the impacts for the Adelaide Park Lands

- Whilst there is some information in the public domain, it is still early stages.
- During a meeting yesterday between The Lord Mayor, the Chair of the South Australian Motor Sport Board, Mr Andrew Daniels and their CEO, Mr Mark Warren the following advice from the Motorsport Board was provided:
  - As the Motorsport Board moves into the next detailed design phase the State Government will consult with key stakeholders, particularly with the City of Adelaide, noting those consultations have now begun with yesterday's meeting.
  - The Motorsport Board has advised that briefings are also being held with various park users including cycling clubs, event organisers and current lessees as well as schools located immediately adjacent the proposed circuit.
  - The Motorsport Board have indicated that a key requirement for the circuit design is to bring increased life and purpose to the heritage grandstand in Victoria Park, with the circuit planned to run directly in front of the grandstand. A playing field will be retained as part of this redesign process.
  - The current Supercars race paddock and temporary pit building will be relocated to near Fullarton Road from its current location in the middle of the park. The intention here is to maintain an open park with the construction zone moved to ensure greater park access for patrons.
  - The proposed circuit realignments and additional track may impact patron movement throughout the Park at various times, however the Motorsport Board will work closely with City of Adelaide to minimise disruptions.
  - A significant road resurfacing program will be undertaken by the Department of Infrastructure and Transport in order to meet the FIM's stringent safety requirements.
  - Any potential impacts to biodiversity areas in Victoria Park will be identified and addressed through consultation with the City of Adelaide, noting there is an Environmental Consultant as part of the design team.
  - There will be an impact to the Glover East Playground with detailed design works to determine the scale and impact underway. It is the Motorsport Boards intention that park users will retain the same level of amenity they now enjoy into the future.
  - The indigenous Corrobboree area (Place of Reflection) at the junction of Pirie St and East Terrace was fully considered in the design to not be impacted.
- What the advice from the Motorsport Board confirms is that there will be impacts in the Adelaide Park Lands.
  - There are realignments and additional track that will need to be undertaken within Victoria Park. This will likely impact along the Fullarton Road edge, the bike and pedestrian connection across Victoria Park connecting Halifax Street and Grant Avenue. Again, detailed design work will need to be undertaken to incorporate those changes. They advised that the track extensions that head south will not encroach into the exclusion zone of the Copper Chequered Butterfly. It may also result in the removal of some hard stand within Victoria Park as the new track layout is formalised.
  - Within Victoria Park there will need to be consideration to playing fields, which the Motorsport Boards proposed design is seeking to maintain, notably around the Heritage Grandstand, which their design is seeking to highlight, noting the straight and therefore supporting infrastructure is pushed away from the centre of Victoria Park and toward Fullarton Road.
  - There will also be engagement by the Motorsport Board with cycling groups regarding the Criterium Track, the lessees such Vic Park Social Club and operators in the Heritage Grandstand and nearby Kiosk.
  - In addition to the track works on Victoria Park, there is a significant road resurfacing program, across the whole of the track layout, which will also need to be planned and some of that work currently suggests that there will be elements of new track to be laid and some of that will be across Park Lands.

- An example of this is in the area around Glover East Playground and there will likely be an impact to Glover East Playground. Again, more detailed design is needed to then make decisions on the degree of impact to the Playground and the approach to ensuring our residential community in that area as well as other users such as CBC have access to the same level of amenity they enjoy now into the future.
- It is not currently the view that there will be any impacts to our recently delivered public artwork, Place of Reflection, even though that part of East Terrace will form part of the track.
- To accommodate the track proposed there will be Tree Removals. As the Motorsport Board refines their design we will have a clearer handle on the scale, but that impact does include Significant and Regulated Trees and we will ensure that there is a tree replacement program. The Motorsport Board has indicated it will work on minimising those impacts as it moves through its detail design phase.
- There are also impacts to projects proposals through third parties such as the Adelaide Three Day Event which will need to be considered.
- There has also been discussion around the O-Bahn exit and that is a further area of focus, particularly in event mode as to how that service will be either redirected or operated when the MotoGP and bp Grand Final are on.
- We have been clear in this first engagement that the cost of these works impacting City of Adelaide infrastructure and the Adelaide Park Lands will need to be borne by the Motorsport Board and State Government.
- Mr Daniels is aware of the requirement within the South Australian Motor Sport Act 1984 for consultation with the Adelaide Park Lands Authority and he was very committed with Mr Mark Warren to brief both Council and Kadaltilla at key points.
- The Lord Mayor noted that some Board Members have raised questions with the Administration as to whether a briefing and/or consultation will occur with Kadaltilla. Administration have confirmed they will coordinate a briefing opportunity as soon as possible and inform the Board as soon as that is organised.
- At this stage it is important to continue this early dialogue and get the opportunity to engage with the Motorsport when they come and brief the Board in more detail.
- A mature *Dracaena draco* (Dragon Blood Tree) has been gifted to the City of Adelaide by Prince Alfred College.
  - The tree was carefully removed and relocated on the evening of 19 February 2026 to the northern area of Victoria Park / Pakapakanthi (Park 16), adjacent to the historic red brick former racecourse buildings and near the Dragon Blood Tree that died in 2024.
  - The existing tree has been retained, as it continues to provide interest and amenity for park users.
- On 22 December 2025, correspondence was received from the University of Adelaide informing the Kadaltilla Board, as a stakeholder under the legislation, that the University of Adelaide and the University of South Australia are transitioning their respective operations from 1 January 2026 to Adelaide University under the Adelaide University Act 2023 (SA).
- A major public art initiative led by the State Government commemorating South Australian Aboriginal leaders was publicly announced on 4 February 2026.
  - The Lord Mayor joined families of the honourees and the Attorney General, Kyam Maher, to announce that six Aboriginal leaders will be honoured with statues at Elder Park.
  - The first is a life-size statue of Dr Lowitja O'Donoghue who was a leading advocate for SA's First Nations People and will be erected at the Tarntanya Wama/Elder Park walkway, on the southern side of Karrawirra Parri/River Torrens by mid-2026.
  - Future statues of prominent Aboriginal leaders Gladys Elphick MBE, Dr Alice Alitya Rigney AO PSM, David Unaipon, Yami Lester OAM and Garnett Ian Wilson OAM.
  - The statues will be designed by acclaimed sculptor Robert Hannaford AM.
  - The statues are being funded by the State Government with support from the City of Adelaide in facilitating their placement within the CBD.









### Purpose

The purpose of this report is to seek the support of the Kadaltilla / Adelaide Park Lands Authority for the relocation of existing turf wicket cricket training nets in Red Gum Park / Karrawirra (Park 12), within the Licence Area.

The project will enable the Lessee, Adelaide University, to establish a new oval and make greater use of the playing fields by its sports clubs and the broader community, including Adelaide Botanic High School students, who utilise Park 12 for physical education.

The cricket training nets will be relocated to a site previously used for lawn tennis, which has not been utilised for this purpose since 2010. The relocation will also facilitate the replacement of the existing chain wire mesh fencing with a combination of post-and-rail fencing and new black chain wire mesh fencing around the training nets only.

The current training nets area will be returned to open Park Lands use, enabling unrestricted access when not in use by the Lessee.

### Recommendation

# Discussion

## Background

1. The Adelaide University (AU) has a 42-year lease for facilities in Bullrush Park / Warnpangga (Park 10) and Red Gum Park / Karrawirra (Park 12), including a lease for the community buildings and a licence for the playing fields.
2. The playing fields in Park 12 include AFL and cricket ovals, a soccer pitch and two sets of cricket training nets (southern and central), as shown in **Attachment A**.
3. The southern cricket nets are hard-wicket training facilities and are to be retained in situ.
4. The central cricket nets are turf-wicket training facilities and are proposed to be relocated by AU to the south-western corner of their licensed area. The relocation of these facilities will allow for the existing soccer pitch in Park 12 to be converted to an AFL/cricket oval. This would facilitate AFL and cricket programming across three playing fields in Park 12, with soccer training and matches consolidated into Park 10.
5. The relocation of the central cricket nets will enable increased use of the playing fields in Park 12 by AU's sports clubs and the broader community, including Adelaide Botanic High School students, who utilise Park 12 for physical education.

## Site Context

6. The proposed relocation site is within AU's licensed area and includes an area formerly used for lawn tennis. The lawn tennis courts have not been used since early 2010, and access is currently restricted by 3.6 metre high chain wire mesh fencing.
7. Beyond the fenced lawn tennis area, the site is bordered by a community building (grandstand) with adjacent car parking to the north, a mature Moreton Bay Fig tree to the west, and War Memorial Drive to the south.

## Facility Design

8. The proposed new turf-wicket training nets have been designed in accordance with Cricket Australia's Community Cricket Facility Guidelines, as shown in **Attachment A**.
9. The training nets are oriented north-south, with the turf wickets located at the northern end. This ensures the turf wickets are away from existing trees, providing optimal growing and maintenance conditions.
10. The training nets will comprise black chain wire mesh fencing that is 3.6 metres high on the western, northern and eastern sides, 4.5 metres high on the southern boundary, and black netting placed over the top. The training nets are 36m wide and 41m long.
11. When in use, retractable fencing on the western and eastern sides will extend to the southern boundary, to ensure cricket balls remain within the enclosure.
12. The existing tennis court fencing will be removed and replaced with low post-and-rail fencing to the west of the new training nets.
13. The area to the west will be an open lawn area, with seating positioned to utilise shade from the Moreton Bay Fig tree.
14. AU originally proposed that both the turf wicket and hard wicket training nets be co-located in this southwest corner of the park. Council Administration was not supportive due to the extent of construction planned for the area adjacent to the Moreton Bay Fig tree. The hard-wicket training nets will remain in situ and accessible to the community.

## Access

15. The new training nets will be utilised by AU sports clubs and sub-lessees, predominantly during the summer season. The turf wickets are not publicly accessible.

## Next Steps

16. Subject to Kadaltilla's support, this proposal will be presented to Council in April 2026 for consent to progress with a Development Approval application.










