QUESTION ON NOTICE

Deputy Lord Mayor, Councillor Phillip Martin will ask the following Question on Notice:

‘Could the Administration advise how many ratepayers were entitled to exercise a vote in the recent Central Ward supplementary election only as a consequence of owning property that could be categorised as a car parking space, garage or any similar space designed for vehicles and what were the largest number of such voting entitlements in these categories?’

REPLY

1. As the 2025 election was a supplementary election for the Central Ward only, each owner is entitled to a singular vote regardless of the number of properties owned.
2. Rating assessments can represent a singular carpark space, a group of spaces or an entire multi-story carpark.
3. Of the 350 rateable assessments meeting the above criteria, 179 individual voting entitlements were identified that are directly attributed to a ratepayer only owning a car parking space, garage or any similar space designed for vehicles within the Central Ward.
